Free School Meals

The cost of living crisis has seen changing circumstances for many of our families.

Could you now be eligible for Free School Meals?

This is not to be confused with Universal Infant Free School Meals which every EYFS and KS1 child receives. If a child is given Free School Meal status, the school receives extra funding which we can then use to help support children of families with financial need. It is very easy to check if you might be eligible and we would encourage all of our parents, including Years R, 1 and 2 to check their status here:

A successful application will help you, and will also help the school provide what your children need.

Help!

We are sure you will have noticed that we are fighting a constant battle with moss falling from our roof and gutters. Mrs Ovenden sweeps every morning but within an hour, it's all back!
