



House martins Autumn 2

English - our key texts are:



We will be writing using these two books as inspiration. As villains we will write an autobiography to inform, with a letter to persuade from previous learning. Moving onto the story by Emma Carroll, we will entertain our readers with a time-slip narrative.

Maths

- Multiplying and dividing numbers up to 4-digits by 2-digits using factors and formal written methods
- Fractions, including decimal and percentage equivalents
- Units of measure; capacity and reading scales
- Order of operations
- Factors, multiples, primes, squares and cubes
- Express missing numbers using algebra
- Solve problems using four operations, using estimation to check answers for reasonableness
- Interpret information in tables
- Convert between units of time
- 3-D and 2-D shapes
- Know that angles are measured in degrees and identify acute, obtuse and reflex angles
- Describe positions on a grid
- Draw and translate simple shapes in the full coordinate plane and reflect them in the axis

Guided Reading

We continue to develop reading comprehension skills through our book Clockwork, by Philip Pullman. Further short texts, poems and novels will be shared over the next few weeks.
